**Session 1: Responding to Harassment Consultations at Hiroshima University**

The Institute for Foreign Language Education and Research at Hiroshima University will hold a Faculty Development (FD) program entitled *“Faculty Development for Foreign Language Instructors—Toward the Realization of a Better Teaching and Learning Environment”* for instructors teaching foreign language courses.

Most foreign language courses in the general education curriculum are designed for first-year undergraduate students. However, some students have trouble adjusting to university-level classes, which differ significantly from high school education, and cases of trouble arising between instructors and students are not uncommon. The aim of this FD program is to help instructors and students build positive relationships and to create a better teaching and learning environment.

In the first session, we will hear from Associate Professor Hiromi Yamauchi, a full-time consultant at the Harassment Consultation Office, about our university's definition of harassment and the flow of harassment consultation. We hope you will join us and find this session helpful for your course management. Faculty members who teach subjects other than foreign languages are also very welcome to attend.
